Thank you for considering an exciting and life-changing opportunity in summer ministry as part of the 2023 Ozark Mission Project College Staff team. The mission of Ozark Mission Project is to transform lives through worship, fellowship, and hands-on mission, and we are grateful for your interest in being a key part of a life-changing summer as a member of our College Staff team.

In the summer of 2022, our College Staff team built relationships with almost 200 neighbors and hosted close to 500 community builders across 10 communities in Arkansas. Collectively, they oversaw the completion of 61 wheelchair ramps, 41 painting projects, 100 small construction projects, and tons of yardwork, power washing and other minor projects. Because of their commitment, we were able to be ALL IN for mission work around Arkansas and the impact went deeper than the almost 300 projects completed. Their commitment was a part of transforming lives. And we are dreaming even BIGGER for Summer 2023. We're asking you to consider your role as part of God's MASTERPIECE!

TITLE: Summer College Staff

<u>ORGANIZATION GOAL:</u> To equip and empower our college staff to make a global difference as disciples encouraging disciples.

<u>OVERVIEW</u>: College Staff serve as a dynamic part of our leadership team at each location and are responsible for overseeing the overall experience of the mission week for community builders, neighbors, and community partners.

<u>AUTHORITY:</u> College Staff are employees of Ozark Mission Project and carry the authority and responsibility of being representatives of the organization. During mission weeks, College Staff report directly to the Mission Week Director, but as employees, College Staff report to the Director of Programs and CEO.

RESPONSIBILITIES AND EXPECTATIONS:

- Keep Christ at the center of the mission week and maintain personal devotion with God
- Be present. Not just physically, but emotionally and spiritually for the work being done and for the team
- Enforce and maintain care of our community partner spaces (host churches, shower houses, etc.)
- Be responsive to the needs of the overall mission, understanding that your role may look different week to week
- During Prep Week:
 - Work with Leadership Team to set the mission week up for success
 - Determine the schedule of projects and overview of the week
 - Communicate effectively with Leadership Team to coordinate assistance needed during week
- During Mission Week:
 - o Build relationships with community builders, neighbors, volunteers, and community partners
 - Be available and responsive to each of your assigned Family Groups
 - Oversee the completion and quality of work on each project for your family groups
 - Guide the schedule of the day from morning wake up through lights out
 - Coordinate and assist as needed with nightly programming and worship
 - Complete all mission week close-out tasks

REQUIREMENTS:

- Have a vehicle with proper registration and insurance
- Be 18 years or older and at least one year removed from high school graduation
- Obtain a CPR certification prior to April 1st, 2023
- Submit all required application materials
- Pass a thorough background check and sex offender registry check
- Be available to work on all work dates and participate in all required training.
